

The Bar Mitzvah ceremony contains some of the oldest symbols and rituals in Judaism. During the service, Sid will be wearing a kippah (head covering) and tallit (prayer shawl or super-power cape as Rabbi Mark refers to it). Sid's tallit was given to him as a young child by his grandparents after a trip to Israel, and has inspired his Jewish learning journey. His kippah was also handmade in Israel, and was worn proudly for years by his great grandfather Aaron. To mark this rite of passage, Sid will lead us in a traditional Saturday morning service. The service is made up of 5 main parts.

Silent Offering **The Amidah**

Amidah, translated as "standing" refers to a series of blessings recited while standing. The Rabbis declared that a worshipper should come before God as if approaching a king or queen -- first with words of praise, then should ask one's petitions, and finally should withdraw with words of thanks. Thus, every Amidah is divided into three central sections: praise, petitions, and thanks.



Revelation - The Torah Service

The Torah service is when we all pay homage to the Torah. Written by hand with quill and ink on parchment, the Torah is a scroll upon which the Old Testament is written. Each week, we read and study a section of the Torah, completing the full text each year. The Torah is the holiest object in Judaism. It is not touched by hand. Sid will use a special instrument called a **yad** to mark his place while he reads.

During the Torah service, we open the ark, lift the Torah and parade around the sanctuary (pine grove or barn) before reading it.



Each week's Torah portion is broken up into smaller sections. For each of the sections, members of our community will be honored with an Alyiah - 'coming up' to sing two blessings. Today, Sid will share the fruit of his studies with us as he chants a portion of the Torah and teaches us about it. He will also have an Aliyah. Sid had to learn the words and the trope (musical pattern of notes), and then commit them to memory in order to be able to chant the portion directly from the Torah scroll today. Rachel will be supporting Sid in his Torah reading. Haven't having read from the Torah since she was Sid's age, she can affirm that without punctuation marks, vowels, footnotes, page numbers, or musical notations, even learning a few lines is quite challenging!




WHOMEVER WRAPPED in a tallit in one's youth will never forget: taking it out of the soft sack, opening the folded tallit, spreading it, kissing the border along its length (sometimes embroidered and sometimes embossed). Afterwards, a great sweep over the head like the heavens, like a huppah, like a parachute. Afterwards, folding it around one's head as if playing hide and seek, and then wrapping the body in it, tight tight, letting it fold you like a cocoon and then opening it like wings for flying. And why are there stripes and not black-white squares like a chessboard? Because squares are finite without hope and stripes comes from infinity and go on to infinity like the runways at the airport so that angels may land and take off. When you wrap yourself in a tallit you cannot forget coming out of a swimming pool or the sea and being wrapped in a great towel and casting it over one's head and wrapping in it, tight tight and shivering a little and laughing and — blessing.

So we embrace Shabbat: day of rest, day of wonder, day of peace.


